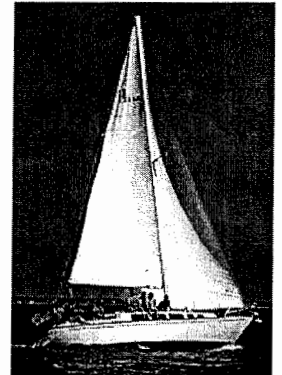


Cape Cod & Islands Maritime Trek

Friday: Arrive back to JNW (AM), Enjoy Camp (rifle, shotgun ETC), Family BBQ in Evening/Awards.

Boating - Set sail into Cape Cod Bay for an overnight cruise; slip your kayak into a saltwater tidal pond, paddle across pristine salt marshes, tidal rivers, coves and protected bays.



Biking - Cape Cod has miles and miles of bike paths and bike friendly roads. Bike along woodland trails that pass working cranberry bogs and kettle ponds; through scenic Cape Cod villages; along the shores of Cape Cod Bay and Atlantic Ocean beaches and through the sand dunes of the Province Lands.

Camping - camp where no other visitors can go! Cape Maritime has obtained special permission for camping in the Cape Cod National Seashore, the Islands and at other locations on Cape Cod.

Fishing/Shell Fishing - Dig for clams, pull a lobster pot and cast your line from the beach into the Atlantic surf where the REALLY BIG ONES hide!

Historic Sites - site of the Pilgrim's first landing, Cape Cod offers over 300 years of American and Maritime heritage to experience and explore.

NOTE: Participants will be biking from activity to activity; although the terrain is flat several miles will be put on each day.

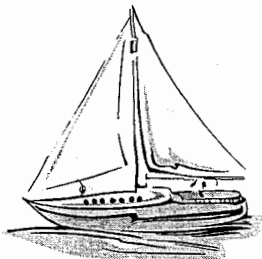

Details: Camp Nautical is an opportunity for any Sea Scout attending to gain skills and experience. Advancement can be a source of pride and measure of your success in Scouting. Advancement in Sea Scouting is a measure of your nautical knowledge and your performance as a leader.

The Seamanship Program will allow you experience most of the requirements needed for the Rank of Ordinary. With structured courses in the morning and evening you will learn about boats, marlinespike seamanship, ground tackle, piloting, communications, time, swimming, cruising, safety, galley, sailing, drill, compass, signaling, quarterdeck leadership training and ornamental rope work. You will find fun in the in the afternoons devoted to free time. You will graduate with a report of your accomplishments, new friends and memories to last a lifetime.

Sea Scouting is an adventure on sea and land - for you, young men and women between the ages of 14 and 21.

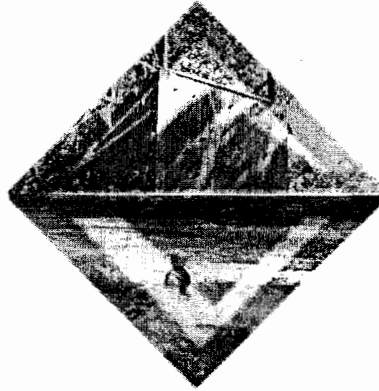

At the June Norcross Webster Scout Reservation

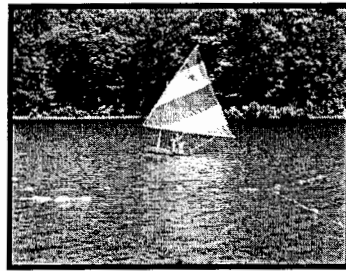
August 8-9, 2009

The June Norcross Webster Scout Reservation is located in the scenic New England town of Ashford, Connecticut. Established in 1964, the reservation occupies 1,200 acres of land that is home to approximately 1,800 Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts and Venturers each summer during its six-week season. Scouts stay in 2 man wall tents and sleep on cots with mattresses. Three square meals are served daily in the recently renovated Greer Dining Hall. The Reservation boasts its own private lake, so swimming and boating are part of the fun. Many of the traditions at J.N. Webster derive from its predecessors **Camp Quinebaug** (1942-1963) and **Camp Wakenah** (1917-1972). Welcome (or Welcome Back) to YOUR Scout Camp.



The 2009 Odyssey is a unique overnight opportunity for Venturers, Sea Scouts and their units. The overnight is designed for fellowship with the opportunity to work on some Outdoor Skills as well as network with fellow scouts in the venturing program. The open program includes a themed beach party, **Pistol Shooting, Sailing, Kayaking, Land Navigation, and Skeet Shooting**. This is a Coeducational program under the supervision of BSA **camp staff and trained Venturing Crew Advisors. COME AS A CREW/SHIP or COME PROVO**. Program starts 10 on Saturday and concludes at Noon on Sunday.

AdVENTURE CAMP 2009

June Norcross Webster Scout Reservation

August 9-15, 2009

AdVenture camp is a **Co-Educational residential program** for Ventures and Boy Scouts located at JNW in Ashford, Connecticut. The Mission of the program is to offer a fun and exciting outdoor program for older youth primarily in the Venturing & Boy Scout programs. Participants sleep in two person tents with cots. The program is under the supervision of a trained Scoutmaster and female Venture Crew Adviser.

AdVenture camp is split into focus areas "section time" and group time. Some group programs are experiencing the Project COPE course and socializing at Pizza parties and group challenges. This is the first program of its kind that has a wide variety of programs under a central umbrella. The Venturing program and methods will be in full demonstration. All participants must be 13 years of age or older.
